### HOW IT CAME TO BE

On November 8, 1945, a committee of The Children's Aid Society of Brant Board members, composed of Mr. Harold Orr, A.E. Plant, H.S. Tapscott, Mrs. John Noble, Mrs. F.A. Ballachey and Mrs. Stanley (Helen) Forbes was asked by the President, Mr. Gordon Campbell to discuss matters pertaining to the Family Allowance Act. The Children's Aid Society of Brant had received their first family allowance cheque amounting to \$1,357.00 and it was necessary to decide how the allowance should be handled in order for children to receive the most benefit. At that time, the Endowment Fund became a permanent committee and this money was used for the development of special talents and for clothing that were not provided for in the per diem rate.

Future meetings authorized the purchase of small wagons,

bicycles and summer camp holidays for children in care and long term planning for college educations.

On July 30, 1998, the application for the Articles of Incorporation were submitted with the first directors being:



Richard Carpenter, Cathy Cleaves, Mabel Dougherty, Chris Eivers, Kenneth Harris, Randy Wilson, Arthur L. Binkley and Stan J. Worosz. The Charitable Registration Number completed the establishment of **The Children's Aid Society of Brant Endowment Fund Incorporated.**

The Incorporation specifies: To establish a fund by

fundraising and to apply all of the fund for charitable purposes carried on by, in connection with, in relation to, for the benefit of or to enhance or improve the services by or the facilities of The Children's Aid Society of Brant.

**100% of funds donated to the Endowment Fund are applied directly to its programs.**

Each year the Fund assists with tuition, books and living allowance for many of our Wards or former Wards to continue their education—through university, college, apprenticeship opportunities or other recognized programs of study that prepare students to further their educational attainment levels and/or enhance their opportunities for employment. It is the intention of the Fund to prepare Wards for a successful future!

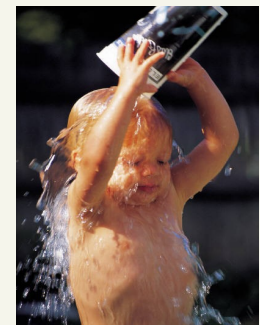
### SUMMER CAMP OPPORTUNITIES FOR OUR COMMUNITY CHILDREN

Each year, The Children's Aid Society of Brant Endowment Fund sends over 300 children to a local residential or day summer camp where they experience camp activities—some for the first time!

The children are referred to the program by agency social

workers who are aware that this opportunity would not normally be possible for these children. The average cost per child is \$200.

Volunteer drivers assist with transportation and the Summer Camp Coordinator position is funded through Ministry grants.



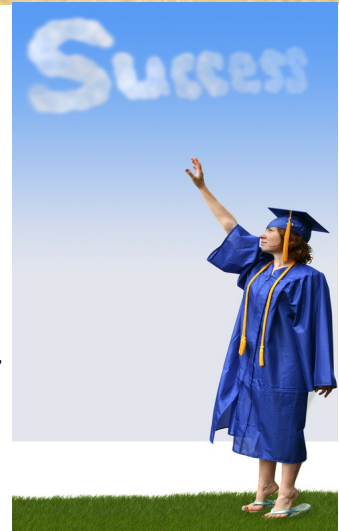
## T. DIXON MOOR AWARD

T. Dixon Moor was hired as an Agency staff member in 1962. He worked 15 years as a social worker serving the Six Nations of the Grand River Reserve and the Mississaugas of the New Credit Reserve.

After his retirement in 1977, he served ten years on the Board of Directors. He was known as the "peacemaker" and the "calm voice of reason".

In 1988, the award was created in recognition of T. Dixon Moor's significant contributions to the Society and the Endowment Fund. This award honours a Former Ward, over the age of 21 who has attained a significant level of personal improvement, including educational and vocational achievement. The award is both recognition and inspiration to all crown wards.

Honourees are presented with a \$1000 cheque at the Society's Annual Meeting and their name is placed on a brass banner which is housed in the reception area of The Arthur Binkley Family Resource Centre, 14 Henry Street, Brantford, Ontario.

## GORDON GLAVES BURSARY

This award honours the memory of Gordon Glaves who passed away on November 13, 1991.

Gordon and Jane Glaves served the children of Brantford and Brant County well with love, dedication and care as foster parents for 28 years.

On February 25, 1993, the Board of Directors of The Children's Aid Society of Brant approved the establishment of the Gordon Glaves Memorial Foster Parent Training Bursary.

This bursary values the role of foster parents and encourages them to receive

training to enhance their expertise and understanding.

The award, in the amount of \$1,000, is presented annually at the Society's Annual Meeting to the Brant Foster Parents Association to be used for educational purposes.

## THE ARTHUR BINKLEY AWARD

In 1949, Arthur Binkley became a volunteer on the Agency's Board of Directors.

For over 55 years, he was instrumental in the work of the Endowment Fund and their monetary contributions to children in care. For all of those years, Arthur would assist any of his legal clients who wished to bequeath funds to help the Society's children in Brantford and Brant

County. Those funds, invested and watched over by the Endowment Fund, grew to assist in the summer camp program and education assistance to Society Wards.

The Children's Aid Society of Brant Boardroom and Family Resource Centre have been named in his honour.

The Award is presented annually at the Society's Annual Meeting to a company or an individual who has demonstrated exemplary service and made a significant contribution in furthering the goals and objectives of The Children's Aid Society of Brant and/or The Children's Aid Society of Brant Endowment Fund.
